Consider **2 Samuel 6:12-17**

The ark of God was lost because of **carelessness**. **1 Samuel 4-7**

The ark of God was gone for 20 years. **1 Samuel 7:1-2**

Doing things man's way will fail. **2 Samuel 6:1-11**

David brought the presence of God into a public space.

David brought the presence of God before the **community**.

- ❖ Justice and generosity for all the people is God's will. **Vs 6:19**

II

Consider **Amos 9:11-12**

Amos prophesied during a time of national prosperity.

Amos condemned the **mistreatment** of the poor and needy.

Amos condemned the **oppression** of the least of these.

Amos' solution is God will rebuild the tabernacle of David.

- ❖ At the tabernacle of David there is a community **witness**.
- ❖ At the tabernacle of David there is generosity for all.

Consider **Acts 15:13-18**

The church (the people of God) must become a far reaching people.

The church can never become closed to the community.

The church must speak for those who are **marginalized**.

The church must speak for the **misfits** and **expendables**.

All people matter to God.

- ❖ David's tabernacle desires the **power** of God in public.
- ❖ David's tabernacle desires the **provision** of God for all.
- ❖ *David's legacy is a model of community worship for all.*
