The son of David: A Celebration of Liberation

David left a legacy as a man after the heart of God.

The son of David did the will of the Father, the prophets and the season.

Consider **Acts 13:22**

^{KJV} **Acts 13:22** And when he had removed him, he raised up unto them David to be their king; to whom also he gave testimony, and said, **I have found David the son of Jesse, a man after mine own heart, which shall fulfill all my will.**

- ^{KJV} **Matthew 1:1** The book of the generation of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham.

Jesus did what He saw the Father do. **John 4:34, 5:30** and **John 6:38**.

Jesus did what His Father desired. **Vs 4:34**

Jesus did what the prophets said. **Vs 5:30**

Jesus did things when they were to be done. **Vs 6:38**

Consider **John 12:12-15** and **Mark 11:1-11**

I

The season was Passover.

The setting for Passover is liberation. **Exodus**

- Prophetically it is time “to move from bondage to liberation”.

II

The setting was a crowd of common people.

This was contrary to the Roman oppressors’s entry into the city.

This could be a satire to Pilate’s entry days before.

Instead of a stallion or a chariot, Jesus rides a colt/donkey.

Large crowds always threaten the oppressor.

Large crowds will get the attention of decision makers.

- Even large crowds will experience “push back”. **Vs 12:15**
- Don’t be afraid.

III

The savior leads a celebration of liberation.

The oppressed celebrate by faith before they see anything.

The celebration includes shouting. Hosanna! **Vs 11:9**

The celebration includes waving banners. Palm branches!

The celebration includes an anticipation of liberation!

- Our ancestors learned to shout and dance looking forward to liberation.
